Bruce Johnston, 67, of Carneys Point, NJ, passed peacefully into heaven on September 14, 2020. Bruce was the third son born to Clarence and Thelma (née Smith) Johnston. Bruce is survived by his father Clarence, wife Sandra, daughters Kelly Johnston and Kari Kille, son-in-law Patrick Kille, three grandchildren: Owen, Rory and Madeline Kille, brothers James (Gloria), and John (Lynne), numerous nieces and nephews, and great-nieces and nephews. Bruce was predeceased by his mother, Thelma Johnston.

Bruce's loves were Family, God, Flying and Farming. Bruce joined the Delaware Army National Guard (DEANG) in 1972 at the age of 19. He later became employed full-time by the DEANG and worked there for nearly 41 years until his retirement at the end of 2012. Bruce served in the following roles with the DEANG throughout his years of service working with airplanes and helicopters, retiring at the rank of CW5 (Chief Warrant Officer 5): helicopter mechanic, crew chief, aircraft maintenance inspector, test pilot, maintenance test flight evaluator, instructor pilot, pilot and detachment commander.

Bruce was known to volunteer for deployments, hoping that he could spare other soldiers with young families the difficulty of separation and risk. Bruce's concern for the needs of others was always at the forefront of his mind. Continuing in his desire to serve others, following his retirement from the Army, Bruce began flying for local companies providing medevac services. Most recently, he was a member of the JeffStat4 crew based in Woodbine. Bruce also enjoyed flying his plane in his spare time, landing on the grass airstrip he created on the family farm and taking family members and anyone else who wanted to go for airplane rides.

Bruce's talents were many and diverse. To his family and the many people he regularly helped, he could do just about anything with great proficiency. Bruce was the perpetual teacher, always willing to share his knowledge and experience on a myriad of subjects with others. Bruce could always be found working on a project when he was not working. He enjoyed maintaining the family farm with his father Clarence, helping others in any way he could, and serving as a volunteer for Meals on Wheels.

Graveside service, open to the public, will be held on Saturday, September 19, 2020, at 10:00am at the Lawnside Cemetery in Woodstown, NJ.
