

Charles W. Morris Sr.

Charles Welfred Morris, Sr., 85, of Pennsville, NJ, passed away peacefully on the 22nd of November, 2018. Born in Camden, NJ, he was the son of the late Charles H. Morris and Mabel (Pine) Morris McQuilkin. Charles was a 1951 graduate of Penns Grove Regional High School and he served his country in the United States Navy during the Korean War. He furthered his education by taking night classes at the University of Penn and attending Salem Community College, earning his Associates Degree in Business and Finance.

Charles started his 32 year career with DuPont working at the Stradley Building in Wilmington, DE where he was responsible for buying and selling their tanker cars. To spend more time with his young family, "Moose" transferred to Chambers Works in 1965 where he worked as a pipefitter. From his experience at DuPont and his involvement with their union, Charles was fundamental in driving forth the legislation that would become the Right To Know Act. Charles took an early retirement from DuPont and began a new career as a legal investigator for the law firm of Tomar, Selinger, Simonoff, Adourian and O'Brien in Haddonfield, NJ where he also served on the National League of Legal Investigators for many years.

Throughout his life, Charles volunteered with a vast amount of community organizations such as his service with the Salem County Vo-Tech School Board, Chemical Workers Association Labor Union, New Jersey Right To Know Coalition, New Jersey Statewide Emergency Response Council, Salem County Planning Board, Pennsville Industrial Commission, Boy Scouts of America, the Pennsville Republican Club and PHILAPOSH. Charles was a member of the Order of the Arrow. He is a former delegate to New Jersey Boys State, received the American Red Cross Blood Donor Award, District Award of Merit, DuPont's Pensioner of the Year Award and International Man of Achievement Award. Also, Charles was a member of Pennsville's Septemberfest committee and he served as their Parade Marshall in 1998.

He will be remembered as a loving husband, a proud father, an adoring grandfather and loyal brother, but the biggest mark he made on this earth was his beloved portrayal as

Santa Claus at the National Christmas Center in Lancaster, PA. He was known as the true keeper of the Christmas spirit all year long.

Charles is survived by his loving wife of 63 years, Eileen J. (Williams) Morris; his son Charles W. Morris, Jr. and his wife Sacha of London, England; his daughter Eileen D. Willis of Pennsville; his grandchildren Victoria Morris, Mollie Morris-Pearcy (Oliver), Harry Morris, Daisy Morris, Poppy Morris, Noah Willis, Madeline Willis and Faith Willis; and his great grandson Finley. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his daughter Terri Lynne Morris, his brother Louis "Sonny" Morris and his sister Bertha Caudell.

A memorial service to celebrate Charles' life will be held on Monday, the 3rd of December, 2018 at Adams Funeral Home, 64 Broad Street, Woodstown, NJ 08098. There will be a visitation from 10 to 11 AM followed by the service at 11 AM. Inurnment will be private for the family at the Salem County Veterans Cemetery.
