Judith (Judy) Latham, passed away peacefully in the morning hours of January 7, 2021, in Lakeland, Florida, after more than 13 months fighting Brain cancer.

Born Judith E. Bachman on June 2, 1955, Judy was a 1973 graduate of Penns Grove High School and remained in Carneys Point for the next 34 years to raise her family. Judy was affectionately known as “Mrs. Berry” during her cheerleading coaching days, and “Ms. Judy” during her tenure at Salem Community College, in which she was Secretary for the Athletic Department and interacted with many of the student athletes. In 2007, she moved to Auburndale, Florida, with her husband Chuck, and eventually landed at Keiser University until she was diagnosed with cancer in November of 2019.

Judy was a quiet force to whomever she was around and made an impression on anyone who was privileged to know her. Whether it was helping coach the Twins Cheerleaders to their First Competition, cheering on her boys when they played football and baseball, cheering for ‘her guys’ playing basketball or baseball for the SCC Oaks, she was always supporting those she loved with strength and determination. She loved to read, crochet blankets for anyone who needed or wanted one, build puzzles, and cross-stitch. Her children and grandchildren (affectionately known as Mom-Mom’s Angels) were her life and meant the absolute world to her. She couldn’t go a day without bragging about one or more of them.

Judy was survived by her husband of 13 years, Charles Latham; Her three children, Tony (Minta) Berry of Pennsville, NJ, Kirsten (David) Evans of Carneys Point, NJ, and Jeffrey Berry of Pennsville, NJ; Her three step-children, Michelle Schronce of Greenville, South Carolina, Natalie (Randy) Garrison of Lower Alloways Creek, NJ, and Nicole (Anthony) White of Prince Fredrick, Maryland; Her sister Cindy Bachman of Pennsville, NJ; her brother-in-law David (Denise) Latham of Jacksonville, FL; her Sister-in-Law Alice (Scott) Pulliam of Maricopa, AZ; her grandchildren, Jade, RJ, Jessica, Hayden, Ryan, Emaleigh, Brett, Kaylee, Riley, Max, Justin, and Ben; a slew of nieces and nephews that loved their Aunt Judy, and numerous friends.

She is predeceased by both of her parents, Raymond & Virginia “Ginny” Bachman, brothers-in-law Daniel Latham and Jerry Berry, and sister-in-law Brenda Fisler.
