Alfred C. Mossop, 87, of Upper Pittsgrove passed away on May 2, 2018. Born in Pitman, Alfred was the son of the late George D. & Ellen (Highley) Mossop. He retired from the NJ State Police as a Lieutenant after many years of service. Outside of the State Police, Al served in the NJ National Guard for twenty-two years, retiring in 1972 at the rank of Major. Over the years he served on the Elk Township Resolution Committee, was President of the Jim Thorpe Lions Club, served as Regular Chairman of the Lions Club and was Deputy Sheriff of Carbon County, PA. He was inducted into the Pitman High School Sports Hall of Fame on November 27, 2005 and the Gloucester County Sports Hall of Fame on March 28, 2006. After his retirement, Al and his wife Nancy relocated from South Jersey to Jim Thorpe, PA., to Kissimmee, FL., and then back to South Jersey.

He is survived by his wife Nancy, four children, Edward C. Mossop, Robert A. Mossop, Cindylu Cameron and Bethann Tiver (Donald), a brother, Donald R. Mossop, fifteen grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. In addition to his parents, two brothers, Lester H. and Frederick L. Mossop predeceased him.

All Services will be held at the Friendship-Finley UMC on Saturday, May 12, 2018. The memorial visitation will begin at 10 AM with the service following at 11 AM.
