Angelo P. DeFeo, 73, of Pedricktown, went home to be with the Lord on December 24, 2023 surrounded by loved ones. Fondly known by many family and friends as “Jack”, he was well known for his stories and leaving a profound impact on others.

Born in Mannington, Jack was the son of Angelo J. & Gloria Vecere DeFeo. After graduating from Penns Grove High School in 1969, he worked different jobs before becoming the Head Night Custodian of Woodstown High School, which he retired from after over 25 years of service. Jack also ran a seasonal family produce stand beloved by many at Cowtown and New Castle Farmers Market that he had worked at since he was a child. He and his brother also oversaw the production of Dreamer’s Dressing and Marinade, which was originally started by his father and sold at various farmers markets and health food stores.

Jack enjoyed taking day trips, especially to New Hope and Margate, listening to oldies music, watching movies, and going to concerts. He was also a great storyteller, as well as a writer of poems and short stories along with other

creative endeavors. He loved his 1965 Chevy Malibu, and a day wouldn't go by that he didn't have his Dunkin Donuts coffee.

He is survived by his wife Rita (Singleton) and daughter Jacalyn (Thomas), his siblings Anthony DeFeo (Sharon) and Rosemarie McAllister (Michael), his niece Michele and nephews Michael (Amy) and Courty (Elena), his five great-nieces and nephews, and his one great-great niece.
