Her very first teaching job was at Pennsauken High School, and she would eventually retire from there as well. Barbara was a devoted and dedicated member of the Catholic Community of the Holy Spirit, where she served as a Eucharistic Minister, taught religious education, founded the “We Care” Ministry and was involved in the planning of and organizing “Christmas Trees on Parade”. She also enjoyed the fellowship at the weekly bible study with her friends from the Elmer United Methodist Church.

She is survived by her sister, Patricia Vukicevich and her husband Ronald; nephews, Ronald jr. (Kelley), Michael (Pat) and Marc; great nieces, Morgan, Madison, Mackenzie, Christina and Caroline and two great nephews, Samuel and Alex.
