Carlton E. Halter, “Bummy” to those that knew him well passed away in his home on Friday, July 3rd. In his 84 years, he defined what a glorious fireworks show truly is. Our lives will all certainly miss his firecracker personality and the sparkle that came with it.

Born November 21, 1935 in Deerfield, NJ to dairy farmers David and Margerette Halter, he was the lucky 13 among six brothers and seven sisters.
