Surrounded by his family, Charles F. Baeriswyl, 77, of Carney's Point passed away peacefully on December 29, 2008 at the Christiana Hospital. Born in Upper Neck, Mr. Baeriswyl was the son of Charles H. & Helen (Boyer) Baeriswyl.
