Clarence 'Glenn' Myers, age 79, of Upper Pittsgrove, Salem County, NJ died on Sunday, March 14, 2021.

Born in Doylestown, Pennsylvania to the late Clarence Moyer and Martha (Litzenberger) Myers, Glenn grew up working on the family farm in Chalfont, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Delaware Valley College, and when the family moved to South Jersey in 1967 Glenn continued to work with his father to establish their family farm in Upper Pittsgrove Township. Family and farming were most important throughout his life.

Glenn enjoyed serving on the Land Use Board for Upper Pittsgrove Township, and he had also been a member of the Upper Pittsgrove Board of Education, serving when the 'new' Upper Pittsgrove School was planned. Glenn was also a member of the Pittsgrove Presbyterian Church, serving as an Elder. He appreciated everyone he worked with over the years who were thoughtful and helpful.

Glenn enjoyed traveling to many national parks and spending time with his children and grandchildren.

Glenn is survived by his wife of 53 years, Elaine (Kline); his brother, Gerald Myers and his sister, Marian Haag (Jerry); his daughters, Michelle Martha

Pearce, Katherine Winifred Myers (Poy Yee), and Joanna Kathleen Brauckmann (Raoul); also, his grandchildren, Ethan and Rhiannon Pearce, Alden Myers-Yee, and Noah and Stella Brauckmann.

Along with his parents, Glenn was predeceased by his infant daughter, Kyna Glyn.
