Surrounded by his family, Eugene Stanley Eisenbrey, 93, went home to be with the Lord on February 28, 2008. Born in Bridgeville, Delaware, Mr. Eisenbrey was one of nine children born to Adonna & Georgiana Eisenbrey. Growing-up on the family farm, taught him the value of hard work and the struggles of lean times. After graduation from Milford High School in Delaware, he worked several jobs learning his craft as an electrician. During World War II, he served in the 56th Signal Battalion landing in Normandy on D-Day+1. While serving in Northern Ireland, he met his future wife, Hilda Charles and were eventually married in Port Stewart, N. Ireland.

Mr. Eisenbrey, along with his wife and two children at the time, moved to the Elmer area in 1949 initially living at the parsonage at the Friendship UMC. He worked for Chew's Electric in Elmer and eventually began his own business, Eisenbrey Electric and Refrigeration Service.

Over the years, Mr. Eisenbrey has served his church and the community in many ways. As a member of the Friendship UMC for over 50 years he has held many posts: Sunday School Superintendent, member of the Administrative Council, church choir, Sunday School Teacher and a member of the Board of Trustees. Always available to help build or repair the church facilities, he would extend these skills on several mission trips to South and Central America to help build churches and homes with OMS International. In

addition, he served as a volunteer ambulance driver and a member of the Odd Fellows. He loved to bowl and sponsored a team and played for the league until last year.

He is survived by his loving and caring wife, Hilda, his children, Ian and his wife Carol of Elmer, Elizabeth and her husband Robert Widdifield of Pittsgrove, Christine Eisenbrey of Louisiana and Denise and her husband Philip of East Windsor, NJ, ten grandchildren, eight great grandchildren and his brother Howard and his wife Grace of Del. He was predeceased by five brothers and two sisters.

A Service will be held on Monday, March 3, 2008, at 10am at the Friendship UMC, 149 Friendship Rd., Monroeville, NJ. Interment will take place at the Friendship UMC Cemetery.
