I tried to explain if she fell and broke a hip the cost for her hospital care would be enough to operate the fan for 200 years. She was also a constant worker for the Red Cross blood drives. She faithfully called donors and manned the check in table at every Blood Drive for years. It was very hard to find a replacement for her when she retired from that job at about 88 years old. As a long time donor I miss the hospitality that Florence and her generation used to provide. It just doesn't happen that way anymore.

Finally her concern for children. Her history teaching school and ongoing concern for the Sunday School, even when she couldn't teach anymore.
