George W. Cassaday Sr., 82, of Monroeville, went home to the loving arms of his Lord and Savior on Tuesday, August 2, 2016 at the University of Pennsylvania Hospital.

George was born on October 5, 1933 to Benjamin and Elizabeth (Mood) Cassaday. He grew up on his family farm; plowing fields, collecting eggs and driving loads of tomatoes to Campbell Soup Factory. He graduated from Woodstown High School, where he was a member of the FFA. Following graduation he enlisted in the United States Army and served his country proudly.

Upon returning from military duty, George married the love of his life, Betty Ann (Knabe) on November 15, 1958 at the Ferrell United Methodist Church. He continued working on his family's farm, becoming sole owner until passing the torch onto his son, George Jr. in 1999.

A few years after their marriage, George and Betty gave their life over to Christ. George was a member of the First Baptist Church of Elmer, faithfully attending for over forty years.

George loved his family dearly and gave generously of his time to helping them in whatever capacity needed. His great sense of humor, calm and patient spirit was the foundation of who George was. After almost a lifetime of working the fields, George semi-retired (does a farmer ever truly retire); he and Betty spent their winter months in Florida; daily walks on the beach, relaxing and watching the NCAA games cheering on their favorite basketball team Duke University. He loved working in his yard especially his flower beds, taking great joy and pride in his landscaping designs.

George is survived by his loving wife, Betty; three children, Karen (Bryan) Malik of Colorado, George (Christy) Cassaday Jr. of Monroeville and Rebecca (Mark) Raymond of Egg Harbor Township; seven grandchildren Katelyn and Kristin Malik, George III, Cody, Clay and Faith Cassaday, and Lia Raymond.

Services will be held on Tuesday, August 9, 2016 at Adams Funeral Home, 64 Broad St., Woodstown, NJ 08098 with a visitation from 9 - 11 AM followed by the service at 11 AM.
