Gerald T. Hoglen, 70, of Pilesgrove passed away on March 15, 2010. Born in Pilesgrove, Mr. Hoglen was the son of Larvie A. & Virginia (Green) Hoglen. He graduated from Woodstown High School in 1957 after lettering in both football and baseball and soon thereafter joined the U.S. Army. He served in the army from 1957 till 1960 serving thirteen months in Korea. During his service in the U.S. Army, he received the Good Conduct Medal and the Korean Occupation Medal. One of Harrisonville's best known personalities, Jerry was a member of the Harrisonville Volunteer Fire Company for 37 years and a postal employee for 35 1/2 years retiring in 1992 after 21 years as the Harrisonville Postmaster. Soon after his retirement from the Post Office, Jerry started working at the Marlton Recreation Park in Woodstown retiring as the supervisor in August of 2007 after fifteen years.

For many years Mr. Hoglen worked, along with his best buddy Clem Homan on the sidelines of the Woodstown High School football games and as a part of the chain crew that took care of all of equipment and anything else football related. In addition to Woodstown football, he volunteered his time as the equipment manager for McCorristin Catholic, where his son coached, and currently at Hamilton West High School where Tom currently coaches as well as at the Adams Tallifero All-Star Game.

He was a member of the Salem County Civic Softball League for twenty-one

years winning nine championships. He coached in the Tri-County Midget Football Association and for the Woodstown Little League. Mr. Hoglen was inducted into the South Jersey Football Coaches Hall of Fame in 1998.

He is survived by his wife of forty-nine years, Barbara (Skinner), his daughter, Barbara Conto of Pilesgrove, his son Gerald T. Hoglen and his wife Barbara of Trenton, grandsons, Brian and his wife Tiffany Conto of Alloway and James Conto, Jr., of Pitman, granddaughters, Jamie Lea Conto of Pilesgrove and Kristin Lettiere of Atlanta, GA, great granddaughter, Peyton Lillea Conto of Pilesgrove, four brothers, Larvie A. Hoglen of Pilesgrove, Richard A. Hoglen and his wife Kathy of Mantua, Larry E. Hoglen and his wife Rae of Clarksboro and Robert W. Hoglen and his wife Elaine of Shelton, Washington. He was predeceased by his son-in-law, James C. Conto.

A viewing will be held of Thursday night, March 18, 2010 from 6 till 8 pm at the Adams Funeral Home, 111 S. Main St., Elmer, Nj 08318 and again Friday morning starting at 10am at the funeral home. The service will follow the morning visitation at 11am with interment at Lawnside Cemetery in Woodstown.
