Harlan Denis Hanson of Pennsville, N.J. passed away peacefully at his home on July 9, 2021 at the age of 86 years. Beloved husband of 61 years, to Shirley Anne Hanson (Deuser). Denis was the loving father of Harlan Denis Hanson Jr., Nathan Erick Hanson (Kara), and Ryan Albert Hanson (Natasja).

Denis is survived by two sisters, Carla DuBois (Allan) and Bonita Smith as well as his grandchildren (Harlan Denis Hanson III, Bryant Christopher Hanson, Kathryn Jeanette Chase, Joseph Paul Hanson, Christine Flynn Hanson, Lauren Nichole Hanson and Sasha Anne Hanson) and great grandchildren (Savannah R. Denis retired from United States Coast Guard after serving 28 years in active duty and as a longtime educator and administrator at the United States Coast Guard Academy. Denis played Basketball at the United States Coast Guard Academy and enjoyed the outdoors, reading, playing cards, but most of all he was an advocate for lifelong learning. He received a Bachelor of Science degree from the United States Coast Guard Academy and Masters degrees from the Naval Post Graduate School and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. Denis

commenced his doctoral studies at Yale but was interrupted by active duty obligations which included multiple summer tours of commanding the Coast Guard tall ship, the "Eagle", and enjoyed taking classes at the University of Delaware in his retirement.
