Obituary for Hilda (Rowe) Paulas

Hilda Elizabeth Paulas (Ne: Hilda Rowe), age 87, passed away peacefully Wednesday evening, November 16, 2005, after a long battle with emphysema. Hilda leaves behind her husband of 63 years, Robert Paulas , son, John Paulas of Goldendale, Washington, daughter and son-in-law, Judith and Glenn Struck of Milford, De. and grandchildren, Brian Struck of Villanova, Pa., and Jennifer Struck, of Greenwood, Delaware.

Born to Herbert L. Rowe Sr. and Hilda Rowe (Veader) of Hickory Tree (Morristown) in 1918, Hilda's family had a long history in the area. Her grandfather was an early chief of police in Chatham Township. The Veader family was one of the earliest in the Morris County area, having arrived prior to 1620. (Those known as the Sons of New Amsterdam, and were of lineage to the Dutch Royal family.)

Hilda grew up on River Road, Chatham Twp., where she attended the Red Brick School, with her brother Herbert. (Deceased 2004). Hilda then attended the Southern Boulevard School from its opening. She concluded her education at the Chatham High School on Fairmont Avenue where she graduated in 1936.

Hilda was an active member of the auxiliary of American Legion Post 92 in Chatham, serving as its president and in many other capacities. While residing in Chatham Boro, Hilda worked at Harper Bros. Publishers in New

York City, General Photo Products on Summit Ave., Chatham, and as a secretary for the Chatham Board of Education.

In 1962, Hilda relocated to Fredon Twp. (Sussex County) New Jersey where she continued to live and work until 1983. While in Fredon, Hilda was employed as a secretary at the Anken Chemical & Film Company, Newton, NJ and later worked as office manager at the Andover Intermediate Care Center and Nursing Home complex.

In 1983, Hilda retired and moved with her husband, Bob, to Pittsgrove Twp., in Salem County, New Jersey. She was a member of the Olivet United Methodist Church, and later the Union Grove United Methodist Church. She leaves behind many friends made while residing in Pittsgrove. In July 2004, Hilda and Bob moved to Milford, Delaware with son-in-law and daughter, Glenn and Judy Struck where she resided until her death.
