



## Horace R. Macconi

Horace R. Macconi, 90, of Pennsville and Stone Harbor, NJ passed away on August 10, 2014. Born in Brockton, MA. Mr. Macconi was the son of John & Assunta (Vinci) Macconi. Starting at an early age. Mr. Macconi was always very ambitious, hard working but he also enjoyed the pleasures of life. At the age of twelve he started working in his father's bakery, Rena's Bakery, as a delivery boy. Not long thereafter, he joined the U.S. Army and would serve in Germany during WWII. Once he got back to the states, he knew from the beginning he wanted to own his own business. Using the leads from his delivery routes, he started Homac Vending Service and would begin placing cigarette and candy machines as well as jukeboxes in locations throughout Southern New Jersey, Delaware, Northeast Maryland and PA.

A beach lover, Mr. Macconi loved going down to the shore and he continued this passion with his family. His and Mary's love for the shore, led the two of them to operate, at the time, the largest arcade in New Jersey on 96th Street & First Ave. in Stone Harbor. Working day and night, they established both a successful and well-respected business in the community. In 1983 they moved the arcade to its current location, RiGi's Amusement Center, where it has continued to thrive and be a playground for multiple generations of people going to the shore.

His passion and excitement about life led him to other adventures as well. In everything he did, he would look for the challenge, the excitement, and the thrill he would get out of it. This thrill and energy in things, led him to becoming a Champion Boat Racer, travelling down to Miami and around the country racing his boat the "Duke's Gal". He also had a passion and love for race horses and would eventually have his own stable of race horses as well as travelling to Vegas to see Sinatra and to spend a little time at the tables.

Mr. Macconi was also a huge Red Sox fan. At the arcade, he has all his Red Sox memorabilia on display. Even around town, people knew when he was coming when they saw that "Green Pick-up Truck with Red Sox plates".

Mary (nee: Davis), his loving wife of 51 years, daughters, Gina Sue Macconi and Beth White (Alan), brother, John Macconi, sister, Gloria Marandola, two grandchildren, Wesley White (Ashley) and Jennay Batson (Matthew) as well as four great grandchildren survive him. In addition to his parents, his son Richard and four siblings, Roland and Pete Macconi, Laura Gagliardi and Rena Molinari predeceased him.

A viewing will be held on Wednesday night, August 13, 2014 from 7 until 9 PM at the Adams Funeral Home, 18 E. Maple Ave., Penns Grove, NJ 08069. On Thursday morning, August 14, 2014, the visitation and the Mass of
