Jack Leroy Gulliver, 86, currently of Pittsgrove Township, NJ passed away on December 13, 2016. Born to the late Harry Roosevelt and Gladys (nee Tyson) Gulliver, Jack grew up working on the family farm in Numidia, PA, later started his own farm and family in Greenwood, PA with his wife, June (nee Boudman) and, following the passing of his wife and a decline in his own health, he ultimately moved to Pittsgrove, NJ to live with his daughter, Dawn Hess and her family.

Jack will be remembered as a man who loved his family and worked hard for them. He was a member of the Christian Gospel Fellowship in Millville, PA. Jack spent the bulk of his career working as a machinist for Orangeville Manufacturing in PA. And, although it was only for a few years, he fondly recalled the time that he was a truck driver. Despite having only an eighth grade education, Jack was extremely smart and inventive. He constructed his own machinery and lathe and built his own radio, as well he taught himself Morse Code and calculus. Jack enjoyed operating his HAM radio and scanner and would listen to music from all over the world. He also loved to garden and work in the yard, driving the lawnmower around until every leaf was gone. Jack was also an exceptional woodworker, creating pieces of furniture and children's toys. Up until the very end, he was always planning for his next project.

Jack is survived by his daughters, Dawn Hess and her husband Scott of Pittsgrove, NJ and Jennifer Leach and her husband Kent of Chillicothe, OH; his grandchildren, Caitlin and Jordan Hess and Austin, Andrew and Alex Leach; his sister, Madge Hicks of Laguna Hills, CA; and his brother, Mark Gulliver and his wife Janet of Friedens, PA. Along with his parents, he was predeceased by his wife of over 40 years, June Gulliver and his sister, Gloria Barrett.
