James C. Sannino, 68, of Elmer, NJ, passed away on March 14, 2014. James, known as Jim, was born and raised in Philadelphia to the late James R. and Rose Sannino. In his youth, James helped out with his family's fish market even though he ironically developed a seafood allergy later in life. At heart, James was a true cowboy who loved his horses, participating in racing, cutting, and team penning. As a child growing up in the city, before the era of television westerns, James developed his love of horses by watching the milkmen deliver their products door to door in horse drawn wagons. His enthusiasm for the horses was rewarded by the milkmen who taught him how to drive the wagons and groom horses at local stables. He had the right touch or as it is called, "soft hands on a horse." He continued to own, train, and ride horses throughout his life in a variety of locations including Cowtown Rodeo and his own farm. James graduated from West Catholic High School in Philadelphia where he excelled in track and field and served his country in the U.S. Army, stationed in Germany in 1964-65, where he also represented the Army in track and field events. James was employed as a lineman for Philadelphia Electric, a truck driver for Breyers Ice Cream and ran a painting business on the side. Ultimately, he established himself as a regional sales rep for Shirk Pole Buildings providing barns and utility buildings to many customers in South Jersey. This is only a brief snapshot of James's many talents, life adventures, and accomplishments.

James is survived by his loving wife of 25 years, Linda Sannino; his children, James J. Sannino (Patricia), Christopher Sannino (Michelle), Michael Byrum (Tara) and Corinne Mesmer (Robert); his grandchildren, Jamie, Ashley, Patrick, Tyler, Airek and Makayla; and his brothers, Joseph Sannino (Luz) and Martin Sannino Sr. (Mary Ellen). He was predeceased by his parents and his sister, Philomena Nardini (John).

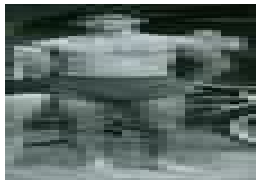
