He appeared in several shows from the Colonial Skating Club in Haddonfield. Jack was also a member of the Atlantic City Skating Club and enjoyed skating at the Convention Hall. He couldn't believe she was so short. He also loved Hawaii and Ireland.

After a brief stint as a prison guard, he realized that was not for him. Jack joined the Sunoco Corporation and worked at Ocean City, NJ Turnpike, and Pitman. He enjoyed the Turnpike because he waited on several famous

people.
