Joseph C. Larsen, age 80, of Franklin Township passed away on Saturday, October 22, 2022. Born in Livingston, NJ to the late Louis C. and Natalie (Fenrich) Larsen, Joseph grew up in Butler, NJ and was a graduate of Butler High School. He later attended the University of Mississippi. In 1965, Joseph moved his family to the Poconos and, in 2004, he moved to Malaga, NJ with his fiancé, Jan Reimer. He was a private pilot and also enjoyed flying remote control airplanes, touring the country on his motorcycle, and SCUBA diving.

Joseph spent his career in construction and development, building homes; a tradition that started with his great grandfather Lars in 1892 and passed along to his grandfather Louis and his father L.C., ultimately leading Joseph to organize the Sun Construction Company in 1965, of which he was the founder and president. He ran Sun Construction and put to practice all that he had learned working summers for his father. He was also the first president of the Pocono Builders Association and, later on, worked for the Ad Energy Company.

Joseph is survived by his fiancé, together for 25 years, Jan Reimer; his children Penny Larsen Nowicki and her husband Frederick of Florida, Patricia Larsen, also of Florida, Joseph R. Larsen and his wife Danielle of New York and Eric Larsen and his wife Ashley of Texas; his grandchildren Scott DiGregorio, Katie DiGregorio, Savoy Larsen, Elodie Larsen and Clara Larsen;

and six nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his brothers Louis and John Larsen
