I've been afraid of losing Keith for a long time now, so much so I convinced myself he was going to be fine, even if he didn't make a full recovery, he would still be here. I didn't get to spend nearly enough time with him, and I will always be saddened by that. He and I had so many more memories to make together, now he lives on through me, and all of us.
