Marilyn A. Dilks, 76, of Lower Alloways Creek, NJ, went home to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on December 7, 2022. Born in Salem on December 26, 1945, Marilyn was the daughter of Linwood H. and Marjorie Ketcham Dilks. She graduated from Salem High School and from Nyack Missionary College where she majored in Bible and Music. She became a classroom instrumental instructor, teaching concurrently at five different schools throughout New York districts. She had many private students, and also taught part time at Nyack Missionary College. Her personal instrument of choice was the flute, which she would play at weddings, concerts, church services, etc. After retiring in 2001 and moving back to New Jersey, she volunteered teaching music at Bridgeton Christian School, served on its Board of Directors, played with the American Legion Band, taught Sunday School and played her flute every Sunday at her church, Canton Baptist, where she was a long time member. Marilyn's interests included photography, crocheting, traveling abroad, and she was an avid reader.

She is survived by her sisters: Nancy Dilks Brobst (Bob) and Betty Dilks Boulden; three nieces: Tara Boulden Travis (David), Erin Boulden, and Jenny Brobst; four nephews: Kenneth Brobst (Krystal), David Brobst (Stacey), Mark Brobst (Carol), and Seth Boulden (Neese); great nieces and nephews.
