Marjorie Marie Williams was born to Dorothy and Paul Haynes, Sr. on March 14, 1948. Marie spent many of her early years in the Deepwater area of Pennsville. Although blind from birth, she didn't let it hold her back. She attended Maryland School for the Blind from kindergarten to 12th grade. During her last 2 years of high school, due to her high grades, she was able to attend Eastern High School in Baltimore, earning diplomas from both schools.

Returning to Pennsville, she enrolled in Glassboro State College, now Rowan University, where she earned her degree in Elementary Education, with a minor in English. She continued her studies to earn a pre-school certification. After graduation, she worked at the Salem Head Start Program.

At the urging of her parents, she started her own preschool in the remodeled basement of her parents' home, later relocating to her church, the Pennsville Nazarene Church. For the next 16 years she touched the lives of countless children and their families from all over the Pennsville area. Along with her school, she also taught Sunday School and Junior Church at the Pennsville Nazarene Church, and served actively in its missionary department. Working with children was Marie's passion to the end. She loved and adored all of her grandchildren, especially the little ones.

She was married to Charles Williams on Aug 21, 1982. They had 2 children:

Megan Tighe (John) and Ryan (Zena), a stepdaughter Lori, 4 granddaughters: Tori, Raeann, Kloie, Lakota, and 4 grandsons: Lauden, Lachlan, Zeke and Leland. She is also survived by her brothers Paul Jr. (Buddy) and wife Linda, Dale and wife Tracey, Danny Hall and Danny Garcia, sister, Marcia Percy and husband Richard along with a wonderful stepmother Mom Faye.

Camping was a big part of her family throughout her married life, even taking care of her new babies on their first camping trips at the tender ages of 7 weeks for Megan, and 3 1/2 weeks for Ryan. She loved the outdoors of camping, listening to the birds, running water and all of the many sounds of nature that most of us take for granted.

Marie was a strong, courageous wife, mother, grandmother and friend, who will be sadly missed by all of those who knew and loved her.
