Nicoletta "June" Italiano (Latorre), 91, of Carneys Point, NJ, passed away at home surrounded by her loving family on March 16, 2015. Born in Casoli, Italy on August 15, 1923, June came to America at the age of six. She attended St. James School in Penns Grove, and helped out on the family farm. She married in 1945, raising three daughters. June was very active in her children's education, sending them to St. James Grammar and St. James High School where she served in the Mother's Club and as PTA president for many years. June was also a woman of strong faith, and very devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary and her church. She was a member of the St. Gabriel the Archangel Altar and Rosary Society, the Third Order of St. Francis, a Minister of the Holy Eucharist, and a former member of the Washington Club. She fully lived the catholic life, visiting many friends and families in their illness and death. Her compassionate nature led her to be active for many years with Meals on Wheels. During Lent, she would make dozens of "Easter" bread loaves and distribute them to her many friends. Preceded in death by her husband, Nicholas, and her parents, Luigi and Concetta Latorre, she is survived by her three daughters, Jean Cantino, Gloria Camp, and Angela Greenwald (Scott); three grandchildren, Natalie MacAllister (Whitey), Mark Cantino (Erin), and Roger Cairns (Danielle); three great grandchildren, Zachary Cairns, Lauren MacAllister, and Nicholas Cantino; and many nieces and nephews.
