Richard Paul Grant, 75, of Mullica Hill, NJ, passed away in Mullica Hill, NJ, on June 1, 2026. Born in Pittsburgh and raised in Levittown, PA, he was the son of the late George and Catherine (Schmidt) Grant and was a 1968 graduate of Bishop Egan High School in Fairless Hills, PA. Known by all as Rick, he went on to earn his Bachelor of Science in Agronomy from Delaware Valley University in 1974. He started his career working as a crop inspector for H.J. Heinz in Salem, NJ, where he met Maryann Zarin in 1975. They married in 1978 and settled down in Mullica Hill. Rick's career spanned 35 years working for Syngenta as a Certified Crop Advisor retiring in 2013.

Rick loved gardening and landscaping, using his knowledge of plants and soil to make many interesting and fanciful landscapes. Among his many interests were arrowhead hunting and metal detecting. Passionate about the Civil War, he participated in Civil War tours with Penn State, and was renowned for serving as a Civil War reenactor and playing the snare drum in a pipe and drum band. He particularly enjoyed collecting model trains and many other various items. He was famous for his decorating during each holiday season; his grandchildren loved their Papa for that.

Rick was exceptionally proud of his Scottish heritage and, along with his son Ian, was a regular participant, representing Clan Grant, in the Fair Hill Scottish Games. The clan motto is StandFast, and Rick exemplified that.

Richard is survived by his loving wife of 48 years, Maryann Grant; his son Ian Grant (Julie); his daughter Ashley Grant (Stewart Pearson); his grandchildren Elizabeth, Peter and Emily Grant; his brother Thomas "Tom" Grant (Virginia "Ginny"); and many nieces, nephews and a large extended family. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his brother Gary "Pete" Grant.
