Sarah Schneider, 96, passed away peacefully in her home, surrounded by family, in the early morning of June 17th, 2023. She was predeceased by her husband, Lewis Schneider; her daughter-in-law, Patti Schneider; and her brothers and sisters, Burn, Albert (“Junie”), Milton, Freida, Gladys, and her twin, Ada. She is survived by her son, Lewis Schneider; her daughter, Lisa Jenkins; her son-in-law, Adam Jenkins; her four grandchildren, Zac, Wyatt, Andrew, and Erin; and her three great-grandchildren, Anna, Zoe, and Vivienne. She is also survived by her best friend and brother-in-law, Kenny Burden.

Born in Harrisonville, NJ on August 8, 1926, to Albert and Cora Foster, Sarah was a lifelong resident of Woodstown. She graduated from Woodstown High School in 1946. Her legacy continued at Woodstown High School for the next 70 years, as her son, daughter, grandson, and granddaughter all attended the same school she did. Sarah continued to regularly attend her high school reunions up until 2019. With membership spanning nearly thirty years, she may also have been the longest-running member of the Chestnut Run pool. For thirty years, Sarah worked at the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company as a telephone switchboard operator, first in Woodstown and later in Vineland and Berlin. At the time of her passing, she was the last surviving member of the Woodstown Office Telephone Operators. Over the years, she also worked

at the Godiva chocolate factory, Del Monte, the Wagon Wheel, and as an Avon and Fashion Frocks representative.

Sarah was happily married to her husband, Lew, for nearly sixty years. Sarah's husband was an excellent bowler, and she loved to travel with him for national bowling competitions across the country, including in Rochester, Miami, and Detroit. She also enjoyed many trips to Las Vegas, Atlantic City, and Delaware Park with her husband, and, later, with her daughter, Lisa, and daughter-in-law, Patti. She loved going to the casino with her family and friends right up until her passing. In fact, she went to Delaware Park with her son and daughter for Mother's Day only one month ago.

Throughout her life and up until her passing, Sarah enjoyed working in her yard and tending to her flowers, crafting, doing puzzles, and baking. She preferred eating out as opposed to cooking, and she often frequented local diners with her friend, Kenny. Sarah had a generous heart. She made sure you never left her house without a cup of coffee or some of her famous cookies and brownies. She loved animals, including the many cats she had as pets over her lifetime and the stray cats and birds she regularly fed. Sarah was truly beloved by all who knew her. Sarah spent her last day surrounded by friends and family in her home, where she had lived seventy years. As she left this Earth, the last words she heard were "we love you." Sarah's kind and gentle spirit will live on in the hearts of all of those who were lucky enough to know her.
