Ventura J. Salcedo, 96, currently of Wilmington, DE and previously of Sewell and Clayton, passed away on May 24, 2017. Born in Piedras Negras, Mexico, he was the son of José and Mary (nee Herlinda) Salcedo. Ventura proudly served his country during World War II and the Korean War in the United States Navy from 1942 until his retirement in 1962. His specialty was catapults' and arresting gear, of which he would eventually be an instructor, aboard the aircraft carrier, the U.S.S. Kearsarge. After his time in the Navy, Ventura took a civil service job in Lakehurst, rebuilding and testing jet engines. He loved gardening, as he was a farmer at heart, and he could carve anything out of wood.
