Vito J. Ficcadenti, 92, born in Penns Grove, formerly of Pennsville, and currently residing at Merion Gardens in Carneys Point, passed away at home on November 22, 2013. The son of the late Nazzareno and Angelina Ficcadenti, Vito was a 1938 graduate of Penns Grove High School and served his country in the Army Air Corps during WW II. He worked for 42 years at DuPont including positions with the Burnside Lab, Carneys Point Plant I and eventually retired at the Experimental Station in Wilmington DE. After retirement he worked for 20 years at Colucci Lumber. Vito served as an officer at the Washington Club, Mother of Grace and the Knights of St. Gabriel. He was secretary/treasurer for the Eastern Bowling Association, secretary for the Plant One Union and he was active with the Evergreen Girl Scout Camp Committee. Vito was a devoted member of the St. James R.C. Church where he served as an usher and also served on the Parish Council.

Vito is survived by his wife, of 67 years, Anna (Romano), his daughters, Judith Perlmutter (Martin) of Houston, TX and Carol Klessel (Dave) of Pennsville; his grandchildren, Stefanie Klessel, Judith Flitcraft (Ronald), Brian and Allison Perlmutter; his great grandchildren, Madison and Gabriel Flitcraft. and his sisters, Gina Ficcadenti and Elsie Kute. Along with his parents, he was predeceased by his brother, Domenic Ficcadenti and his sisters, Ida Francheschi, Santina Roncace, and Rose Hennessey.
